

RESOLUTION NO. 2024-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE COMMISSION OF THE VILLAGE OF BISCAYNE PARK, FLORIDA, WAIVING THE COMPETITIVE BIDDING PROCEDURES PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-139 OF THE VILLAGE'S CODE OF ORDINANCES AND APPROVING AN AGREEMENT WITH GOGOV, INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF CODE ENFORCEMENT CASE MANAGEMENT PERMITTING AND LICENSING SOFTWARE SUBSCRIPTIONS NOT TO EXCEED TEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND SIXTY DOLLARS (\$10,560.00) IN THE FIRST YEAR AND NOT TO EXCEED BUDGETED FUNDS IN SUBSEQUENT YEARS; AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO EXECUTE SAID AGREEMENT AND DO ALL THINGS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Village seeks a more efficient Code Enforcement Case Management system which efficiently tracks code investigations and enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the Village also seeks a system to manage permitting and licensing enforcement, which includes, but is not limited to, a streamlined application process and the tracking of applications and renewals; and

WHEREAS, GOGov, Inc. has Code Enforcement Case Management Software for Permitting and Licensing which meets the Village's needs at a cost of Ten Thousand Five Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$10,560.00) for the first year; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-136(c) of the Village's Code of Ordinances requires that the Village Commission approve all purchases of or contracts for goods or services in excess of \$10,000.00, subject to the competitive bidding requirements of Village Code Section 2-137; and

WHEREAS, the Village Manager has determined that GOGov, Inc.'s Code Enforcement Case Management Software for Permitting and Licensing is a proprietary software which is the only software that will synchronize with the Village's existing software; and

WHEREAS, Village Code Section 2-139 authorizes the waiver of the competitive bidding procedures by a majority vote of the Village Commission upon the recommendation of the Village Manager that said waiver is in the best interest of the Village due to insufficient time, the nature of the goods or services or other factors; and

WHEREAS, the Village Manager is recommending that, based on the proprietary nature of the software, it is in the best interest of the Village to waive the competitive bidding procedures for the acquisition of GOGov, Inc.'s Code Enforcement Case Management Software for Permitting and Licensing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COMMISSION OF THE VILLAGE OF BISCAYNE PARK, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon adoption hereof.

Section 2. Waiver of Competitive Bidding Procedures. The Village Commission of the Village of Biscayne Park, pursuant to Section 2-139 of the Village's Code of Ordinances, hereby waives the competitive bidding procedures outline in the Village's Code of Ordinances Article VIII "Purchasing and Procurement" upon the recommendation of the Village Manager that it is in the best interest of the Village to do so.


Section 3. Approval of Agreement. The Village Commission hereby approves the Agreement, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A", with GOGov, Inc. for the purchase of Code Enforcement Case Management Software Subscriptions for Permitting and Licensing in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Five Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$10,560.00) for the first year and not to exceed budgeted funds in subsequent years on the condition that the vendor offers a two month trial and evaluation period with a termination provision prior to the initial one (1) year term begins.

Section 4. Authorization of the Village Manager. The Village Manager is hereby authorized, subject to the Village Attorney's review, to execute said Agreement and do all things necessary to effectuate this Resolution.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.




